STAFF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The last few weeks the staff have been working on Number Fluency Assessments where the students are assessed at their individual level relating to counting. This allows us to spot the gaps in their learning and identify ways to support them in this work. Over the year, we will also cover numeration, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division. The staff has also started work on updating our Mathematics Scope and Sequence to reflect the changes in the Victorian Curriculum. This is a more involved process than we expected and will take us several weeks to complete. This will reflect the change in the curriculum to incorporate more real life problems

and situations. The staff have already worked extremely hard to incorporate these changes into their work with students.

Congratulations to all the students who have been taking part in the NAPLAN Tests this week. This can be quite a stressful time for students and I would like to thank them for their hard work and effort. There is only Mathematics left to go which is scheduled for Monday. INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS

FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families the costs of school trips, camps and sporting ac If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The

allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. only need to complete an application form if any

- of the following changes have occurred:
 - lowing changes have occurred: new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year. changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings

commencing this year. Check with the school office if you are unsure
