

Lest we Forget



On Wednesday 26th April. The students took part in an ANZAC Day Service. We were joined by Aaron Violi MP who spoke about the importance of the ANZAC Day service. We laid wreaths in front of our Honour Board and held a minute silence. We also told the students about two former students of the school who had served in World War 1. William Chavin and George Lysaght. whose biographies are below. Thanks to everyone who attended the ceremony



William John Chauvin (3044) (Private)

Before William Chauvin enlisted, he was a carter which meant he drove a horse and cart. He lived on Cave Hill Rd Lilydale. William enlisted on July 21, 1915, when he was only 23 years old. He set off to war from Melbourne on November 20, 1915. He was wounded on July 25, 1916 and reported wounded and missing on October 4, 1916. They were under artillery fire, in a trench, 400 yards from the Germans, when a shell landed in the trench. William Chauvin was killed instantly.

George Stanley Lysaght

Before George Lysaght enlisted, he was a stud groom looking after horses and lived in Lilydale. George enlisted on December 16, 1914 at the age of 19. He set off from Melbourne on May 28, 1915. He was appointed as a driver. In July 1916 he transferred to the 1st Anzac Army Corp and joined the 13th Light Horse Regiment. He returned to Australia on May 11, 1919.

He was awarded the 1914-15 Star, British War Medal and Victory Medal.
