Joh, Maria and Kiara will be working with your child over the course of the year in order to prepare them for school. Joh is our leading teacher who leads Literacy at our school and is also on the leadership team. Maria works with Joh in the Prep area and has over fifteen years experience working in the Prep area. Kiara is new to the team and teaches Prep/1G and will be involved in helping run Pathway to Learning sessions. Together they have a raft of experience and thoroughly understand the concerns and worries you may have for your child starting school. They are there to support you and your child through this year and on into 2024.

INSTRUCTIONAL MODEL

During the Pathway to Learning Program we will aim to follow our School Instructional model. This model provides guidance to teachers and staff about how a lesson should be structured and the important elements that lead to great teaching. It focuses on ensuring that every student receives the quality instruction that they need to ensure they reach their full potential. This model is based on best practice research that puts the student at the heart of all our work. The structure of a lesson is split into three different sections and the quality of the lesson is influenced by the factors on the right of the diagram.

PATHWAY TO LEARNING PROGRAM

Our Pathways to Learning program will consist of structured learning time followed by a school

Structured Learning:

Our structured learning time will focus on various curriculum areas and specific skills to help prepare your child for school. Our experienced Prep Teachers, Mrs Butler and Mrs Orlando will be running these exciting sessions with the assistance of our teacher aide.

Learn about our reading program, different ways to read a book and things you can practise at home to prepare for school. The children will experience a reading session similar to how we run reading with our Prep students.

Development of fine motor skills is a fundamental aspect of school. During our writing sessions we will aim to develop fine motor skills through various activities. We will also help your child to recognise and write their own name, expose them to basic concepts of writing and most of all begin the process of embedding a love for writing.

Mathematics:

During number sessions we will use lots of hands on materials to build on counting skills and number recognition. We will teach them some of the games we use with the Prep children to make learning fun and exciting.

Our measurement sessions are bound to be a tonne of fun! We will focus on length and weight during these sessions with lots of hands on experiences. Come and find out how tall or long objects are, or maybe you'd like to compare how heavy two different things are?

School Experiences:

The second half of each session consists of your child participating in a school experience with various teachers from our school.

Join Mr Ellis as he introduces you to the Science room and all the fun experiments that you can complete

Brighten up your afternoon with an exciting Music session. Sing some songs and play some instruments

Get ready, get active! Let's get outside and build on our gross motor skills and cooperation through some fun sporting activities

Enjoy a wonderful session in the Art room with our Art teacher Mrs Blythe. Create a masterpiece to take home and show your family.

Come along and join in a Japanese session with our language teacher Mrs Daire. Play some games

and learn some new words. Relax as you enjoy some stories and activities in our beautiful

library. Mrs Blythe will read you some of her favourite stories. Robotics:

Bring your thinking caps as you explore some of Lilydale Primary School's robots with Mr Weaver. Can you solve the puzzles with your robot?

Mrs Matthews is somewhat of a Judo expert having taught this in Lilydale for the last 38 years and having represented Australia. She offers lunchtime clubs to the students at our school. Join her for a session and find out what it's all about.
